Register of Deeds

- Find the approximate age of a house
- View records of property transactions
- Search for Deeds here.
- View current and past property documents
- View current and past tax bills
- Probate records (wills) may include a deed, estate details, and taxes

The <u>Sanborn maps</u> at the Library of Congress can also be of use. They have digitized several for the Paw Paw area. These are useful to discover details like building materials, shape, and number of stories.

<u>City Directories</u> allow you to look for individuals, families, or businesses. The local history collection has city directories and farm directories.

Obits of people who used to live in your house can provide clues and/or stories. The local history room has many on file. Look up your town, street and names of the people who lived in your house, if you know them.


